Teaching demands of the teacher both self-respect and humility, objectivity and compassion, idealism and hard-headedness, a sense of gravity and a sense of humor.

Teaching is, in short, a way of living demanding all that is humanly best in those who practice it. For those who practice it best it provides rich recompense in the continuing association with the questing minds and generous spirits of the young.

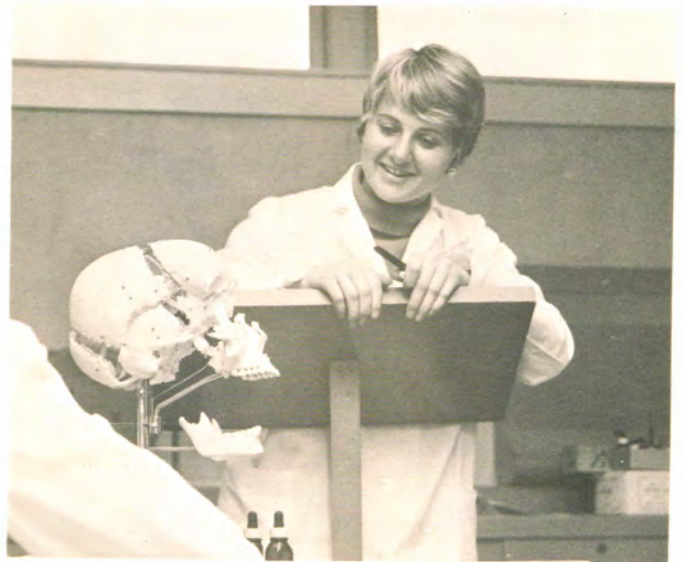

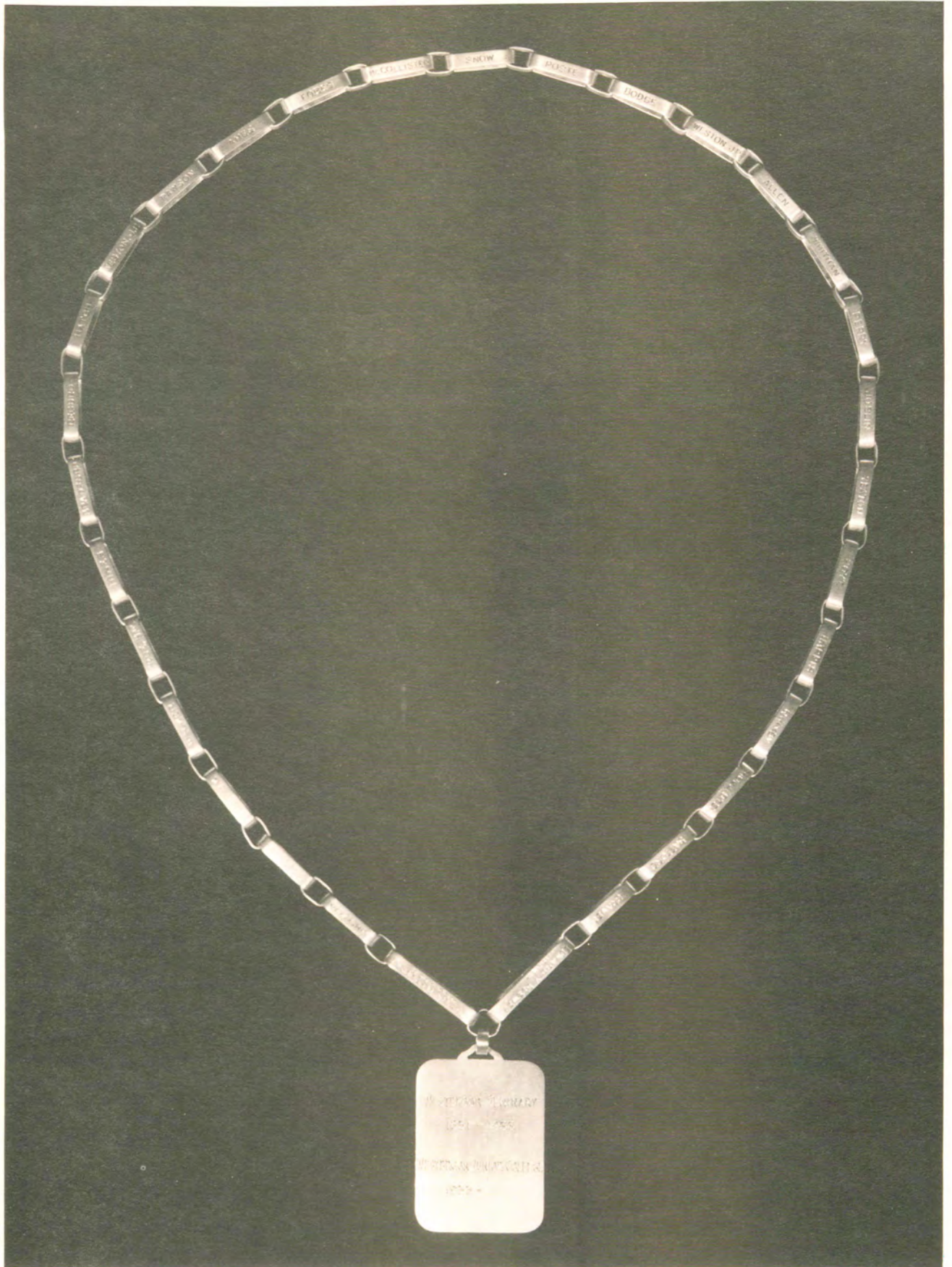






— from *A Young Birch*
