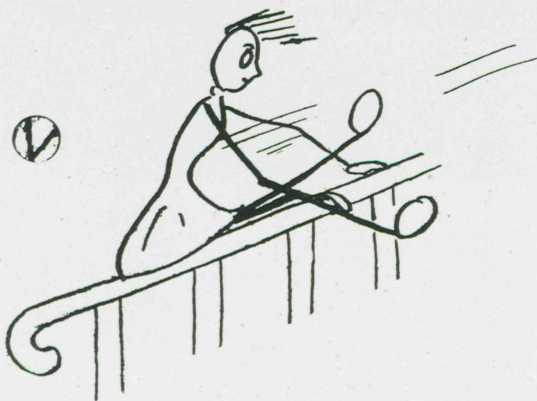




WINTER CARNIVAL
